### **The Splendor of Alternative Dispute Resolution (ADR) in Family Court**

The Judiciary has implemented the Family Masters System since October 2023. Prior to this, the Judiciary has explored various ADR mechanisms for handling family court cases. Some of them were incorporated with elements of mediation.

In family proceedings, Financial Dispute Resolution (“FDR”) and Children Dispute Resolution (“CDR”) are procedures introduced since 2003 and 2012 respectively. In spite of the uniqueness between mediation and FDR / CDR, the court saw the potential for synergy by having a mediator within the process of FDR / CDR. In this light, Mediator-assisted FDR (“M-FDR”) / Mediator-assisted CDR (“M-CDR”) has been introduced in Family Court since 2019. It is a model of a continuous alternative dispute resolution process running in parallel with litigation, which have been proven to be effective in dealing with the financial and child issues in a matrimonial case.

The Judiciary has just launched a new pilot scheme namely Family Court-annexed Mediation Scheme (“FCMAS”) for a period of two years starting from March 2024. Freelance duty mediators, being engaged as service providers, would provide mediation service for suitable court cases involving litigants-in-person on both sides with less financial resources. The new pilot scheme plans to assist the parties to settle their disputes timely and effectively by adopting a collaborative approach among the Judges/Masters in Family Court (“Presiding Judicial Officers”), the Integrated Mediation Office IMO and family mediators at the court premises.
